

Milton Walker - died in 1984 of Alzheimers at 79
- born in 1905 in Rochford, WA

- grew up in Spokane - attended U of W

- 1920's - owned a trucking biz - went broke in 1937.
Moved to Seattle fall of 1937

1930's - WPA at Camp Long - \$10.00 month raise for
landscaping done in spare time.

1941 - Bought vacant lot next to house + started
clearing

1948 - patio + fireplace

1959 - Family visited Ohme Gardens in Wenatchee -
built 1st lake

1960 - Bought entire stock of rock shop for \$150 -

11 weekends hauled 10 ton of rock.

1970's - retired from Boeing

1984 died

Start at Plume agate - from near Boise - Graveyard
Point - none left there now - Wunderstone
Rock Creek British Columbia - Ocean Beach Picture Rock
Limestone - from N.E. Washington - used in making
paper

Topiary - Weeping Sequoia 1968 started
Tri-colored dogwood

Steps - 1st rockwork 1944 - yard was originally
stumps & brush - stepping stones - man & woman
& cats

Beach picture rock - from B.C.

Bicentennial Tower - 1976 - 1 1/2 yrs to build -
arches made in basement, dome built in
place.

Old Bird - Lava from Oregon, near Craters of the Moon.
Milton added snake eye.

*Water comes out of the mountains, over dam,
over waterfalls into lakes

driftwood - Basalt
