It has been a delight to over 26,000 visitors from around the nation and an inspiration to the community, garden clubs, rock clubs, and public school children. has been featured in national magazines such as AMERICANA, ROCK AND GEM, THE LAPIDARY JOURNAL, and ALASKA FEST, and locally in the SEATTLE POST-INTELLIGENCER, THE SEATTLE TIMES, PACIFIC NORTHWEST MAGAZINE, and THE TACOMA MORNING NEWS TRIBUNE. The Garden has also been the subject of KING TV'S "EVENING" program and CHANNEL 9'S "NOTES".
