8x10 color prints, along with captions and bio on Jack Ellsworth. At the moment the Ellsworth group is at the Field Museum under consideration for an exhibit there. But I do have a miniature set, which I'll send along. I've tried to get these things published, but no luck so far.

I turned over my original documents to the Archives of American Art on both these artists, but do have xeroxes of everything.

Wisconsin Public TV did a 10 minute documentary on Fred Smith which includes Jim Janzi and me, which I have also.

I'm sure you'll find the Ellsworth environment fascinating.
