However, presently, Cathey Edwards, Carol Beasley and I are in the process of setting up a non-profit organization, with the help of an interested attorney and a CPA. This seems to be the only avenue if we want corporate or private funding. I have also recontacted Phillips Petrolium Co., with better prospects, after a disasterous initial encounter. Plus, I wrote an article on Ed Galloway for the Jounal of American Culture which I gather they intend to publish.

Given the situation, your offer of letters of support is welcome, but somewhat premature. We will need the support later when we have the nonprofit status in place and begin the fund-raising in earnest.
