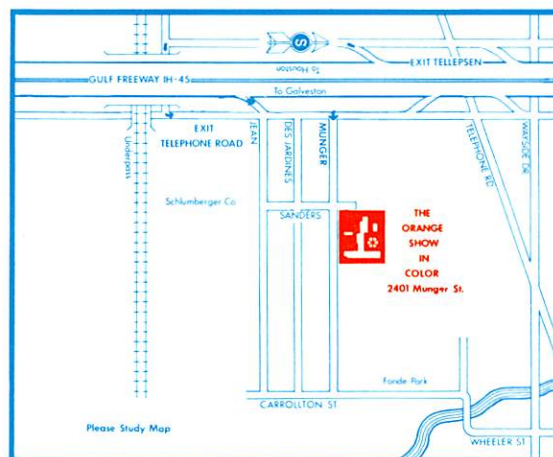

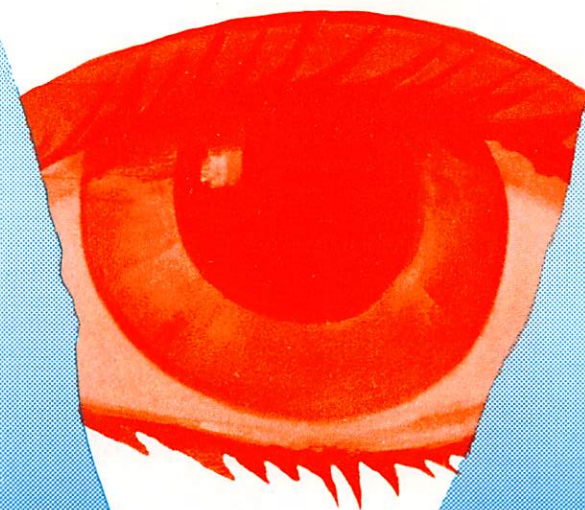

THE 5,000 FINGERS OF DR. T & THE TUXTONES

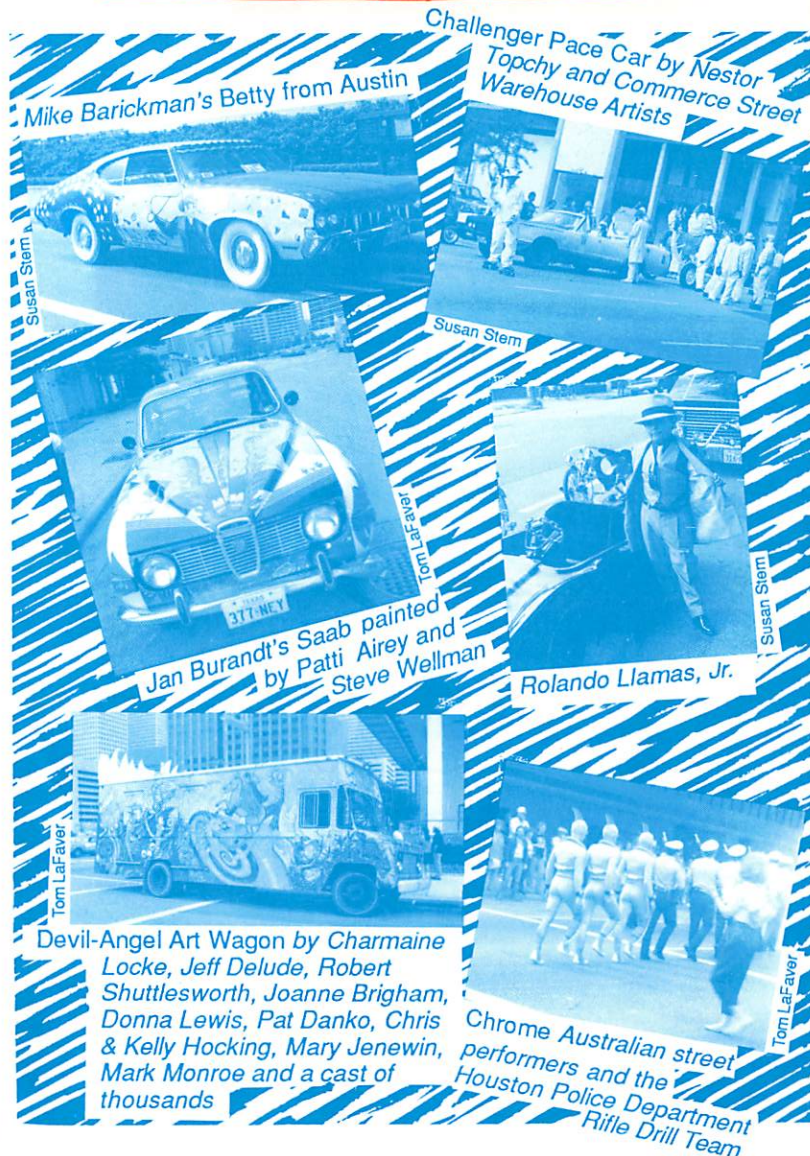
SATURDAY, JUNE 25

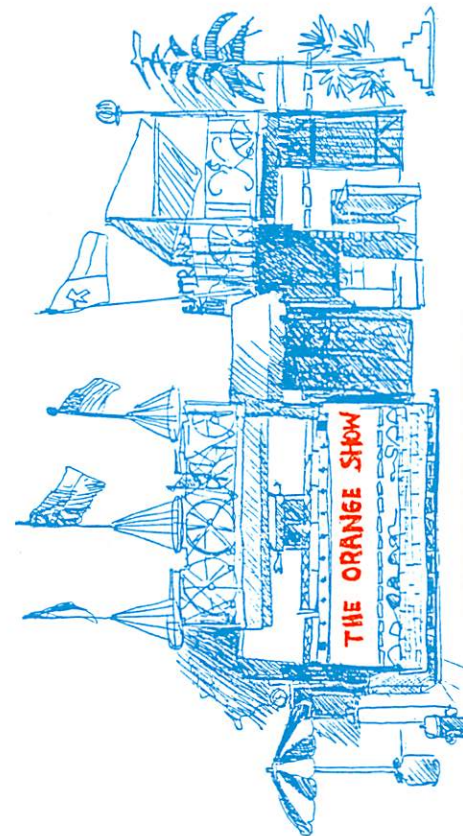

THE ORANGE SHOW



is a concrete fantasy land built over a 25 year period by Houston postman Jeff McKissack and dedicated to his philosophy of good health and nutrition. Wagon wheels, tractor seats, railroad spikes are combined with concrete blocks, salvaged pieces of Houston buildings and mosaic tiles to make a multi-level structure unlike any other in the world. The Orange Show Foundation was formed to preserve McKissack's work after his death in 1980. Each spring The Show is repainted, replastered, repaired and then reopened with an extra special event.

The Orange Show Foundation is supported by private contributions and support from the City of Houston through the Cultural Arts Council of Houston and from the Texas Commission for the Arts.
