Dear Mr. Rosen,

I recently wrote to you concerning a table decorated by Simon Rodia that was accepted into the Museum's permanent collection. It seems I now have an opportunity to return the favormation by giving you updated information about our own piece "Zozobra" by Pops Shaffer.

The information in the book you cited is not quite accurate. My research has revealed that the piece was not meant as an effigy of "Old Man Gloom" at all. A photograph was found of the piece with an inscription on the back "Liza the colored girl." Other versions of this piece exist, as well called "Korea Cora" and "Liza." I also have what seems to be a transcription of a talk delivered at the New Mexico Historical Society Annual Meeting June, 1986 by Sue Schofield. I have xeroxed a copy for you. As far as I know from this research, most of the sculptural pieces remained with the family, only a few made their way into the marketplace. If you know the whereabouts of other pieces I would be very interested in knowing about it.

I hope this has been helpful.
