SPACES has identified over 600 sites in the United States. One, Simon Rodia's Towers in Watts has been declared a National Monument, seven other sites are listed on the federal National Register of Historic Places (this includes Desert View Tower in Jucamba, Imperial County). The California State Office of Historic Preservation declared some ten sites as California State Landmarks in the 1980's.

This art form has been acknowledged in hundreds of museum exhibits (internationally), in thousands of books, catalogs, magazine articles, films, as well as in untold newspaper articles and TV spots.

Niland, is point of destination for the "snowbirders" and because of Leonard Knight's Salvation Mountain. It needs to be protected for the future enjoyment of the public.

Currently the California State Lands Commission is in negotiation with Imperial County to lease the land so the County can improve a 600 acre area known as Slab City as a "primitive campground" for the yearly influx of "snowbirds."
