Jack spent from May to

We met Jack and Elsa in 1948  
introduced by the ranger.

We used to meet them  
socially during the winter.  
They lived on Permitage  
Ave. near Lawrence Ave.

We know nothing about  
his travels or studies.

We don't <sup>know</sup> the sculptures,  
but we sold our cabin  
in 1962, so the sculptures  
were done after that.

Doesn't seem like much  
information, but perhaps  
some is useful.
