I apologize for the delay in responding to your inquiry about folk art environments in Washington State. I hope that this information will still be of use to you and your project. We do not have a comprehensive listing of the type of information you requested. However, we have one excellent example that I know of in Eastern Washington in Coulee City. Girky, who recently passed away, executed numerous whirly gigs which once surrounded the family home. The whirly gigs have been relocated to a city site. The whirly gigs were also incorporated into a Seattle Arts Commission Art In Public Places design team project at the Viewland-Holtman substation—this environment might also be of interest as it combines the work of the folk artist with the professional artist.

There is an artist in Seattle, Lewis (Buster) Simpson who has an interest in the type of projects you describe. He may be able to tell you of other folk art environments to research or folk artists in Washington working in different materials. Buster may be contacted at (206) 625-9486.

I hope this information is of assistance to you. Our newsletter is currently very sporadic due to budget cuts in the Arts Commission.
