From the earliest days of this country, people from all over the world have been coming to settle in Texas, bringing with them bits and pieces of their own heritage. On the "Back 40" friendly pioneers teach you how to spin a lariat, toss a horseshoe, cane a chair, make a

hoecake. Listen to fiddlers, folksingers, bluegrass and western musicians. Pluck a goose, pet a goat, ride in a mule-drawn wagon. Visit the storytellers. Sit in on a calligraphy lesson in the one-room schoolhouse. Stop by the cavalry fort and watch the soldiers drill. Sing along with a gospel group in the shade of the brush arbor. Savor the Flavors of Texas

Festival participants delight in sharing with you their ethnic dancing, cooking, music and crafts. Sample unusual dishes from faraway places . . . tandoori chicken from India, machshi from Israel, placki from Poland, cha gio from Vietnam, haggis balls from Scotland or cold borscht from the Ukraine. The Festival's menu features at least 1,000 selections from more than 26 ethnic groups.

On the Festival's ten stages and at the many impromptu performance sites sprinkled throughout the grounds, you will experience some of the state's finest talent. The stages feature nonstop entertainment of all kinds. Folk dance troupes present traditional dances from Italy, Greece, Poland, Lebanon, Polynesia, Mexico and other countries. Square dancers and cloggers, polka bands and Irish tenors, folksingers and trick ropers, flamenco and tinikling dancers make each stage a whirl of excitement. Grab a partner and dance the fais-do-do, the cotton-eyed joe and the two-step. Everywhere on the Festival grounds the spirit is participation and just plain fun.


