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


THE ORANGE SHOW

The Orange Show, a kind of visionary fantastical miniature Disneyland, is considered by artists and historians to be one of the finest examples of environmental folk art in the United States. It is the work of one man, Jeff McKissack, who for 26 years dedicated his life to the creation of this monument to the orange.

Constructed of concrete block masonry, with balconies, galleries, and an outdoor amphitheatre, it contains handmade metal sculpture, gates and wagon wheel railings as well as a whimsical maze, models, and narrative exhibits all extolling the virtues of the creator's favorite fruit.

McKissack worked alone, with his own hands, conceiving and constructing his private utopia, spelling out his philosophy of hard work and creating what he called a "health show." He believed that the orange was the perfect food and that it gave the body perfect energy.



THE VICKI MILLER CONCERT SERIES FOR CHILDREN

The Brown Foundation and Ms. Marilyn Lubetkin have generously funded a special concert series for children dedicated to the memory of Vicki Miller. Ntozake Shange will provide the artistic direction for this series of participatory events for children. Local artists will lead explorations of dance, music, poetry and the visual arts. The series will be conducted with children from J. P. Henderson Elementary School, and will be open to the public, beginning this spring.
