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Dear Ms. Blake:

Your inquiry regarding the National Register of Historic Places is appreciated. The process of identifying historic properties is done mainly through the efforts of individuals. Your input is essential in helping us accomplish this task. Enclosed is material which explains the National Register Program and the benefits to which National Register properties are entitled.

As a preliminary step in the process, a property must first be placed on the Arizona State Historic Property Inventory. Enclosed is an inventory form and instructions for completing it. This form should be considered only a summary of your research on your particular property of interest. The statement of significance should state why the property is important and give its history, if possible. You may also wish to state if the property is endangered.

Once we receive your completed form, we can evaluate your property to see if it merits further consideration for the National Register. If it does warrant further consideration, we will send you the forms and instructions for a National Register nomination.

If we can be of any assistance to you in completing the inventory form or answer any questions you may have, please do not hesitate to call.
