In response to our conversation yesterday, I am sending you copies of the letters I sent this week to the Governor, Mayor and City Council President in support of Kea's Ark. I am very happy to hear that you intend to file an injunction right away to stop the demolition. I feel very strongly that there should be talks, as soon as possible, between the city, Kea and other interested groups to determine a way to assure the Ark's longterm security in a way that is satisfactory to the city and to Kea. While Kea's vision is uniquely hers, there are precedences for "sites" such as hers in other places around the country. Those might be turned to as possible ways to resolve this case.
