Just "TO SEE WHAT I COULD DO," -- that's what folk artist Clyde Jones said, when Durham photographer Roger Manley asked Jones why he had begun to do paintings in the secrecy of his home in Bynum. The paintings will be shown at Artspace in Raleigh, July 9th through September 9th.

Clyde Jones is well-known for the outdoor animal sculptures he makes from wood and found objects. He displays them in his own yard and on the roof of Crook's Corner Cafe on Franklin Street, in Chapel Hill. He has shown his sculpture at museums in San Francisco, Atlanta, and Richmond. But his paintings have never been shown before.

"TO SEE WHAT I COULD DO" is the title of the first public showing of Jones's new paintings. It's at Artspace, at 201 East Davie Street, in Raleigh, through September 9th. For more information, call 821-2787.
