I am putting together a show of folk art items, most of which will be for sale, opening March 26, 1984 in the Art Institute's Kemper Gallery. I am buying some work outright, and getting other work on consignment. I will be doing some traveling for this purpose, as well as to continue my documentation of environmental sites. As you can see from the note at the bottom of my nomination letter, some of my docu. of Jesse's will be included in a British publication. I have also purchased some more of his work (much of it through a show organized by the University of MO, at Columbia. Write Howard W. Marshall, MO Cultural Heritage Center, Graduate School and Office of Research, University of MO-Columbia 65211 for a copy of a small volume on Jesse he edited); these pieces will be for sale in the show at the Kemper Gallery.
