Dear Ms. Farish:

I assumed my position as President of Pierce College on a full-time basis this past week. One of my first activities was attending a chuckwagon breakfast at Cleveland Park. At that time I had an opportunity to view the collection of folk statuary donated to the college by you and your family. They are truly intriguing and most popular with visitors to our college.

As you can well assume, a new president finds a deskload of tasks awaiting for them when they begin the job. You analyze the material and sometimes you realize that you have some problems arising which often take special attention and creative thought. You may have read stories in the local press that the future of the agriculture program at Pierce College has been the subject of some debate, as has the question of how the Pierce farmland ought to be utilized. While there is absolutely no intention on the part of the college or the Los Angeles Community College District to dispose of Pierce College land, the Board of Trustees has directed the college to undertake a land-use study which will help to determine the future utilization of college land.

The reason for this long preface is that I was also apprised of your intention to build a log cabin in proximity to Cleveland Park to display more of your father's memorabilia. At the present time, I must tell you that all previously planned construction projects for the college have been placed on hold until the "land-use" study has been completed. At that time, we will review the study and the plans for the log cabin and then make an appropriate decision as to completion of the project.
