Mackinaw County, (Johan Henry Ehn)

1897 Sept 15 John born in Violet, Upper Michigan (a logging camp).

His mother, Marie Ella Berg Ehn in Helsinki Finland (orphan)
—a servant who saved her money from childhood to buy
passage on an emigrant ship to the U.S.
spoke Finnish, Swedish, English. 4' 10" tall

His father Johan Ehn sr. born Stockholm Sweden.
5 sisters.

apprenticed as Hydraulic Machine Enginner at age 14
(trained to set up systems for lumber mill machinery
run by the power of falling water before electricity).

When 18, came to U.S. to set up a lumbermill in Upper
Michigan where he met Marie Ella Berg. Married.
Homesteaded a farm near Gould City.

1904 July 27 Mary Leota Esther Gonyon born in
Gould City Michigan. Schooling to 5th grade.

Her mother Maryanne Polly Gonyon came from Ohio.
was one of 9 or 10 children.

Her father Isaac Gonyon French Canadian Widower
Isaac farmed during the summer and worked as a
logger and lumberjack in the winter.

6 children: Mary, Joseph, Stephen, Edith, Ellen,
Amy.

John Ehn and Mary Berg had 6 sons, 1 daughter
Wilhelm, Frederick, Oscar, John, Joel, Victor & Anna.

1940 contracted spinal inflammation

1941 March Moved to Roscoe (Sun Valley) southern California.

Began building a house. Realized need of housing in the area due to burgeoning aircraft industry — built rental units.

When? Many & John both worked in aircraft factories to raise money for construction. John worked for Lockheed. Children helped with construction.

John began a correspondence course "How to Succeed: The best kept secrets of Trapper John." (mailed out since the Depression).

Began to dress in western style as publicity for his trapping & rental business.

1981 finished working on the Lodge and Boot Hill.

1981 May Old Trapper's Lodge named as a California Registered Historical Landmark #939

1981 December 26 John Ehn died of heart failure after breaking hip.

1982 April 2 Mary Ehn died after a series of heart attacks.

1982 June 3 "A brief history of John and Mary Ehn" prepared to go with keepsake packets prepared for friends of Mary & John, John's brothers & sisters-in-law, Mary's sisters & brothers, their 20 grandchildren, 17 great grandchildren & for unborn great grandchildren. Packages include: ① primitive Indian necklace made by John, ② pieces of Mary's costume jewelry collection ③ picture taken on Mary & John's 60th wedding anniversary ④ business card ⑤ perhaps a knickknack from their home.

1983 April 23 - June 4 "Many Mansions: Four Folk Art Environments. Exhibition Beyond Baroque, Venice CA.

1984 Feb 3 State Historical Resources Commission recommended allocation of plaque for Old Trappers Lodge. Site repainted.

1984 Old Trappers Lodge repainted by Dan Ward's brother. (re 1983 letter & recommendations from Don Hawley July 1983 in files)

1985 March 25 Historical plaque unveiled at "Old Trappers Lodge".
