Visions From the Left Coast: California Self-taught Artists Symposities Contemporary Arts Forum October 7th, 1995

The Santa Barbara Contemporary Arts Forum presents *Visions From the Left Coast: California Selftaught Artists*, an exhibition celebrating the individuality and artistic efforts of a diverse group of free thinkers—native and immigrant, urban and rural from throughout California. Co-curated by Ginny Brush and Fran Puccinelli, *Visions* will feature paintings, drawings, and sculptures by over 40 individuals who are largely inspired by mernory, visions, compulsion, or unbridled creativity. The exhibition dates run from August 26 through October 21. An opening reception will take place on September 9.

A daylong *Visions Symposium*, scheduled for Saturday, October 7, will include a Keynote address by Roger Cardinal and talks by Bonnie Grossman of the Ames Gallery in Berkeley, Phyllis Kind of the Phyllis Kind Gallerys New York and Chicago, Susan C. Larsen, art history professor, USC, and a panel discussion to include all of the above and Seymour Rosen, executive director of Spaces, a non-profit organization for the preservation of folk art environments. In connection with this thought-provoking exhibition and symposium is a film/video series and a fully illustrated 66 page catalogue. The catalogue includes essays be Roger Cardinal, Seymour Rosen and Louise Jackson, and Phyllis Kind, as well as biographical information on most of the artists in the exhibition. A related field trip to Watts Towers, Pierce College (with a talk by "Trapper" John Ehn's daughter about the installation of his boothill and lodge figures there), and Grandma Prisbrey's Bottle Village are scheduled for Saturday, September 23.
